Subjects Taught

- Fourth year students can choose four options. The choice of subjects depends on the students' exam results and the number of students interested in each subject.
- **Sixth** and **seventh year** students need to choose at least **three subjects** at A/AS Level. These subjects occupy **nine periods** per week.
- Students preparing for entrance examinations for the universities of Cyprus and Greece will be so intensively prepared in their options that extra tuition will not be required.
